I moved to Florida because the war for equality is being fought here. I'm running to carry on the battle that I helped win in my home state of New York. There I led the LGBT Bar Association and just finished three years as chair of the National Trans Bar Association. I run my own law firm and am a trustee of a union pension fund.



I'm proudest, though of the two young men I've raised – as an out, trans parent with full custody of the kids. So when they come at me about grooming, they're going to get that thrown back in their faces.

My open activism springs from 2016, the year I came out and the year I went to work for the Hillary Clinton campaign. Why then?

I left behind decades as a television news anchor and reporter but continuing my law practice and going to work for the Clinton campaign. I was assigned to North Carolina, where I went door to door, organizing with Trans United for Hillary - so you can see I'm not going to be intimidated.

My plan for Ron DeSantis and his crew is a variation on what we implemented in New York, where Republicans and conservative Democrats had blocked equality measures for years. We primaried obstructionists and elected pro-equality candidates, starting at the local level and working our way up to the legislature, where we flipped the Senate. That paved the way for five years of solid progress, with bills, including one I wrote, being signed into law.

It wasn't easy there, and I know it will be ten times harder here. But I'm not tired - I'm just getting warmed up. I'm all in on this struggle, and with your help we'll save lives by winning it.
